

Key Messages

PRIORITISATION

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples Vaccination

There are still a high number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who have not yet been vaccinated.

Please continue to prioritise individuals who identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander for COVID-19 vaccinations. Where possible, we would encourage practices to directly reach out to patients not already booked in to support this booking as soon as possible.

Some Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people may need additional assistance to receive their COVID-19 vaccinations, such as through a home visit or a longer consultation. The Australian Government has introduced additional Medicare Benefits Schedule (MBS) items to reimburse GPs to facilitate:

- GPs and Other Medical Practitioners (OMPs) who conduct COVID-19 vaccine suitability assessment services in a patient's place of residence can claim a <u>flag-fall</u> <u>fee</u> through the Medicare Benefits Schedule (MBS) to assist with transport costs; and
- the <u>in-depth clinical assessment</u> items are also available if a GP or OMP attends a
 patient for more than 10 minutes to discuss the individual health risks and benefits
 associated with receiving a COVID-19 vaccine.

These items and fees are in addition to the relevant vaccine assessment item. Please note the claiming GP or OMP is responsible for satisfying all requirements when claiming MBS

There are a range of communication resources which may help your practice to support conversations, and make your practice more <u>visually</u> inclusive of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people; as well as to support the <u>consent process</u> and about common mild <u>side</u> <u>effects</u>.
